- Love of reading

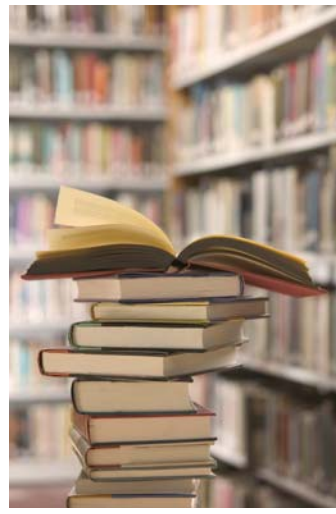
